



Canine Matters

We welcome dogs who join their owners to stay or eat here and walk the coast around us. We hope you don't mind the odd pointer. They'll be obvious to most of you, but with a lot more dogs now out and about, the odd experience reminds us that not everyone remembers the ground rules.

- In order for us to continue to justify being a rare hotel not to charge extra for dogs to stay, do make sure that your dog doesn't jump on the bed (particularly our Welsh blankets) or ease teething pain by gnawing on our furniture. In an ideal world we would ask them to wipe their feet on the mat downstairs as well. Towels are there for your use on the landing.
- Some dogs are more tranquil than others. If they do join you when eating, we ask that they're on a lead at all times. If you're worried that they may get over-excited by other dogs, or you feel they are struggling to settle, please consider leaving them in the car with windows open or in your room. Do bear in mind that not everyone loves or even feels comfortable with being near dogs.
- If you've any concerns at all about the safety of your dog with people, particularly smaller children because of their height and inclination to approach dogs without concern, please take the cautious approach and leave them upstairs or in the car (or even at home). This is obviously non-negotiable and we ask all dog owners to be very open-eyed on this point.
- The fields between us and Lamorna are home to gorgeous bovine milk-dispensers and other fluffy white things. Please make sure you keep your dogs on a leash whenever you are near livestock. Farmers are understandably not known for taking an "ask now, act later" approach when they see unknown dogs near their animals. We'd hate any of our guests to be on the sharp end of this.
- Please help yourself to the following at the K9 station outside Room 7: bedtime biscuits, old towels and sheets for dog beds if your dog is wet or muddy, and water bowls. Our waste bin can be found in the residents' car park: if you've run out of bags, there will always be some at the K9 station.
- Please be ultra-diligent in monitoring your dog's movements (in all senses) when you take them outside and in removing any mess to the bin (see above). Particularly bear in mind the activity of our gardeners who love and look after our beds, lawns and trees.
